

PROCEEDINGS OF THE ATEE WINTER CONFERENCE 2026

Guidelines for authors

- Original manuscripts regarding papers that were presented at and posters that were displayed during the ATEE Winter Conference 2026 and that have not been submitted for publication elsewhere may be submitted to be peer reviewed and, if accepted, published in the ATEE Winter Conference 2026 Proceedings.
- Manuscripts must be both written in English (use a single variation throughout the manuscript) and submitted, as Word documents, before June 30th, through the conference e-mail: ATEE_WinterConf_2026@ie.uminho.pt
- Manuscripts must be typed single-spaced, using Times New Roman, 12 points, without additional space between paragraphs. "Paper" size is A4 and all the margins must be 2,5cm.
- A manuscript should be between 12 and 15 pages (for papers) and 10 and 12 (for posters), including tables, references, captions, acknowledgments, endnotes (no footnotes, please), and appendices. Footnotes are not accepted. Manuscripts must be page numbered.
- Manuscripts should be compiled in the following order: title; authors' names; authors' affiliation; and authors' e-mail; abstract (150 words maximum); keywords (3 to 5, in alphabetical order); main text; reference of the ethical approval (if applicable); acknowledgements (if required); endnotes (if necessary), references; appendices (as appropriate). Table(s), graphs, and figures/images should be included in the text. Table captions should be given above the tables; graph and figure/image captions should be given below the graphs or the figures/images.
- The main text of:
 - manuscripts of papers or posters reporting on empirical research should cover the following issues: introduction and or context of the research; research aim or research question; theoretical framework or background of the research; research methodology (including description and justification of: population and sample, teaching intervention (if applicable) data collection instruments and techniques, and data collection and data analysis procedures); findings and discussion; conclusions and implications for science and or mathematics education.
 - manuscripts of papers or posters focusing on a discussion of a theoretical issue should cover the following issues: introduction to the topic/theme; aim or argument leading question; theoretical argument/framework (may be organized in a few headings); concluding remarks; implications for science and or mathematics education.
- Long quotations of 40 words or more should be indented with quotation marks.
- Details required by any funding and grant-awarding bodies should be provided as an Acknowledgement, as follows:
 - For single agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency] under Grant [number xxxx]."

–For multiple agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency 1] under Grant [number xxxx]; [Funding Agency 2] under Grant [number xxxx]; and [Funding Agency 3] under Grant [number xxxx]."

–For all manuscripts, good English and non-discriminatory language are mandatory. Sexist or racist terms must not be used.

Abstract	Abstract: Text runs on Centred, text smaller (10 points), indented both sides (1cm)
Keywords	Keywords: word; another word; lower case except names Position aligned with abstract, same size as abstract, in alphabetical order
Headings	A. Bold initial cap only B. <i>Bold italic initial cap only</i> C. <i>Italic initial cap only</i> D. <i>Italic initial cap only</i> . Text runs on All ranged left without numbers, no indent below. Insert a blank line before headings
Paragraphs	Indented
Tables	(Table 1) in text. Table 1. Title initial cap only (ranged left above the table) Note: This is a note. (ranged left under the table) Caption, text, figures in the table, and notes must be smaller (10 points)
Figures /Graphs	(Figure 1) in text. Figure 1. Caption initial cap only (ranged left under the figure/graph, outside the figure/graph) Smaller (10 points) Note: This is a note. (ranged left under the figure/graph, and outside it) Caption and note must be smaller (10 points)
Permissions statement for third-party figure and table captions	If the rights holder has supplied text for this purpose, use their text. Otherwise, insert the rights holder's name within the square brackets: © [Rights holder]. Reproduced by permission of xxx. Permission to reuse must be obtained from the rights holder.
Displayed quotations	Indented left and right, smaller font (10 points) if over 40 words, or when appropriate
Lists	(1) for numbered lists Dash bullets if wanted Indented
Equations	Equation (1) in text Centred
Ethical Approval	Reference of the ethical approval (if applicable)
Acknowledgements	Acknowledgements (A heading goes before endnotes or references) Text smaller (10 points)
Endnotes	Notes (A heading) 1. This is a note. 2. This is another note. Text smaller (10 points)

References	References (a Heading) Follow the referencing style of The American Psychological Association (APA - 7)
Appendix	Appendix 1. Title if given (A heading) Goes after References Text smaller (10 points)
Dashes	Spaced en rules for parenthetical dashes Use en rule between spans of numbers (e.g. 20–40), including page numbers in references
Numbers	Numbers: spell out one to nine, then 10, 1000, 10,000 Percentages: 10% (except at start of sentence)
Dates	4 October 2005 in the twenty-first century in the 1970s
